

CONSERVATIVE VISION FOR SLOUGH

Council Tax

- We will reduce Council Tax through efficiencies and savings over Slough Borough Council's wasteful spending. Labour has wasted money on vanity projects such as the Curve and unnecessary road works (like the recent Station Road closure and re-opening northbound). They just love spending your money; we believe in only taxing where absolutely necessary and getting best-value for it.
- We will simplify and merge the structure of the Council's Senior management along the lines that Windsor and Maidenhead Council have to save taxpayers money.

Highways and Transport

- We will remove the failed traffic management schemes that congest Slough's roads.
- We will improve traffic flows, including bringing back bus laybys.
- We will simplify signage and signals to get Slough's traffic moving again.
- We will listen to bus users, seeking enhancement to bus services where possible.
- We will reverse the cut in the Council's provision of concessionary bus passes for pensioners and their carers.

Health

- We will fight for local facilities to be maintained and enhanced across the borough, not cut, removed or 'centralized' to other places. Slough should have at least the same proportion of GP doctors to residents as in Windsor.

Education

- We will review the method of allocation of school places, prioritising where possible local children. We will bring back a University campus to Slough.

Town Centre

- We will reverse the decline of Slough High Street.

SLOUGH LABOUR'S FAILINGS

Traffic Chaos

- Throughout their time in charge of Slough Council, Labour have presided over a series of costly traffic "improvements" that have just caused more traffic congestion.
- Labour have turned driving through Slough on the A4 into a prolonged nightmare- and have plans to make it worse- when you just want to get to your destination quickly and safely.
- Labour intentionally closed Station Road and Burnham Bridge despite residents' objections. It took the Labour Council six months to re-open Station Road northbound - southbound is still closed.
- Labour closed Chalvey from east to west.
- Labour have caused congestion by taking out bus laybys along the A4.
- Labour changed and changed again the road layout at Langley village and the Three Tuns.

They have spent millions of taxpayers money and still can't get it right - they just make things worse!

High Council Tax

- Labour have broken their 2015 manifesto promise to freeze Council Tax. Instead Council Tax rose 3.75% (much above the rate of inflation) in 2016 and it will increase yet again in 2017.

Failed Slough Children's Services

- Under Labour Slough Children's Services have been found '**inadequate**' (the bottom rating), in 2016 **for a third time**. The Ofsted report highlights serious failings in identifying and protecting children at risk, and repeated poor leadership of the service. Labour refuses to take responsibility for all their mistakes and children continue to suffer.

Labour is closing Montem Leisure Centre and Slough Ice Arena

- Labour has again decided to pull down something that cost millions to build only a short time ago instead of keeping our local infrastructure in good condition.

Since becoming Police and Crime Commissioner, Anthony Stansfeld has worked with tightly constrained budgets to reduce crime across the Thames Valley.

- In 2014/15 overall crime fell by 5% across Thames Valley.
- In 2014/15 overall domestic burglary fell by 21% across Thames Valley, it is now at a 42 year low.

The Taxpayers' Alliance released in August that the Office of the PCC (OPCC) for Thames Valley is the lowest costing OPCC in England and Wales per 1,000 members of the electorate in each force area.

In Slough, since Anthony Stansfeld became your Police and Crime

Commissioner in 2012, burglary rates have been cut by half; Anthony deserves your support in being re-elected in May.

Here is the difference:

Labour members really are not interested in how Slough is policed.

Slough's Labour Representatives on the Commissioner's Police and Crime Panel did not attend any of the meetings over the last year.
